4. Client Activity

LCL helped 30 new clients in July. We assisted 10 people with substance use and compulsive behavior issues and 15 presented with mental health issues (including some overlap). General stress and career issues were the most common personal concerns. We assisted 15 men and 15 women. We helped 24 lawyers, 1 judge, 1 law graduate, 1 law student, and 3 family members.

LCL's Family, ADHD, Well-Being, Solo Small, and Discipline groups met remotely, along with a parenting group we are facilitating for Minnesota Women Lawyers. LCL also hosts a weekly open 12-step group. We do not include the 12-step group attendance in our monthly group attendance reports as it is not an LCL "sponsored" group.
